present progressive	future arrangements

<i>be + likely to + base verb</i>	probable events

2. Simple present: Her train to Paris leaves at twelve o'clock.
3. *be + going to + base verb*: She's going to travel around Europe; What countries are they going to visit?
4. *will/won't + base verb*: that'll be amazing; Will she be OK?; my parents will definitely call her; They probably won't remember.
5. *be + likely to + base verb*: She isn't likely to have any problems; it's likely to be a lot.
