Lesson 3: Grammar: must and musn't/have to and don't have to
Objective: talking about things you need or don't need to do .

LET'S START!!!

Para trabajar en esta página primero debemos saber cuándo utilizamos must y have to.

Must / mustn't, have to / don't have to

USE

must and have to

- Use *must* and *have/has to* + verb to say something is necessary: *To be a pilot you have to pass a lot of exams.*

don't have to

- Use *don't/doesn't* + *have to* + verb to say something isn't necessary: *My mom doesn't have to go to work today.*

mustn't

- Use *mustn't* (*must not*) + verb to say something is forbidden or dangerous:
You mustn't use the elevator if there's a fire.

WATCH OUT!

Mustn't has a different meaning than *don't have to*. *Mustn't* = not allowed: *You mustn't talk in class.* *Don't have to* = not necessary (but possible): *I don't have to start work early, but sometimes I like to.*

FORM

Affirmative

have to

I/You/We/They	have to	work hard at school.
He/She/It	has to	

must

I/You/He/She/It/We/They	must	arrive on time.
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Negative

don't have to

I/You/We/They	don't have to	travel far to school.
He/She/It	doesn't have to	

mustn't

I/You/He/She/It/ We/They	mustn't	eat in class.
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Questions and short answers

have to

- Form questions with *do/does* + subject + *have to* + verb.

Questions			Short answers
Do I/you/we/they	have to	work hard?	Yes, I/we/they do.
Does he/she/it			No, I/we/they don't.
			Yes, he/she/it does.
			No, he/she/it doesn't.

Have to, must, and didn't have to in the past

- Use *had to* + verb to say something was necessary in the past. Use it for all persons:
I had to go to the dentist last week.
- Use *didn't have to* + verb to say something was not necessary in the past. Use it for all persons: *Malee didn't have to take a test.*
- In questions use *Did (you) have to* + verb:
Did you have to clean your room on the weekend?

WATCH OUT! There is no simple past form of *must*.

Use *had to* / *didn't have to*:

I had to stay late at school yesterday.
